### **Round Table “Getting out of Crisis: Challenges, Lessons Learned and Future Steps”**

**What:** The Centre for Entrepreneurship and Economic Development (CEED) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) Montenegro will organize a round table: **“Getting out of Crisis: Challenges, Lessons Learned and Future Steps”**. Discussion on the round table’s topic will be preceded by presentations of two studies prepared by UNDP in cooperation with CEED: “Doing Business on the Local Level in Municipalities of Mojkovac, Plužine, Šavnik, Žabljak and Pljevlja“ and “Impact of Crisis on Labour Market in Montenegro“. Results of the studies will be presented by Mr. Darko Konjević (“Doing Business on the Local Level in Municipalities of Mojkovac, Plužine, Šavnik, Žabljak and Pljevlja“), Mr. Dušan Žunić (“Impact of Crisis on Labour Market in Montenegro“), as well as Mr. Milorad Katnić, Deputy Minister of Finance in the Government of Montenegro and Mr. Vladimir Radovanić, Deputy Minister of Labour and Social Welfare.

Previous analyses have shown that companies in the north are more limited in development than the companies in the central or southern part of Montenegro. The aim of the Study on Doing Business in the mentioned municipalities was to analyse conditions in which companies do their business, as well as to identify the main limiting factors.

The Study on the Impact of Crisis on Labour Market provided a comprehensive review of the current status, as well as of the changes that occurred on the labour market in Montenegro as a result of the crisis. The Study also contains a review of the current supply and demand for certain professions, predictions in regard to professions that are in short supply, while special attention was paid to the evaluation of the labour force readiness to accept jobs in the domain of green economy.
