## Western Balkan Regional Environmental Report

The project supported the preparation of the Regional Environmental Report for Western Balkan countries (WBRER). The Report aimed to identify capacity building needs of the ministries of environment, environmental institutions and other sectoral ministries in the West Balkans countries, focusing in particular on the implementation of the environmental policies in line with EU accession process and gaps for the implementation of existing legislation framework and standards that require harmonization with EU legislation. Report was also expected to recommend priorities/actions to be taken in meeting the challenges of environmentally responsible economic growth and effective social inclusion that fights poverty and serves as an advocacy and resource mobilization tool.
